Location—The Opportunity Center is located in The Arc facility at 4901 Lakewood Drive, Waco.

Hours of Operation— The Opportunity Center currently operates year-round (except for Arc holidays), Monday-Friday 10:00 am - 3:00 pm. Participants should bring their own lunch and provide their own transportation to and from the program.

**Program fees**—Tuition is \$25.00 per day. There is a one-time, nonrefundable enrollment fee of \$25.00. There is an annual Arc membership fee of \$20.00.





